

Concurrent Enrollment For Sophomore Students

Is Concurrent Enrollment offered to Sophomore Students?

In some cases a Sophomore may take Concurrent Enrollment courses. These courses are specially marked on the schedule and follow the same GPA requirements as for Juniors and Seniors.

Is it possible for a Sophomore to take a class that is only offered to Juniors or Seniors?

If a Sophomore is an exceptional student, and they have a GPA of 3.6 or higher in their academic courses, with good attendance, they may be eligible for Junior/Senior credit.

How would a Sophomore apply for Junior/Senior credit?

Sophomores seeking Junior/Senior credit need to see the Concurrent Enrollment Coordinator (Jeri Marshall), they need a recommendation from their high school counselor, and letter from their parents requesting this credit. A transcript is printed and sent with the Counselor's recommendation and Parent letter to the Concurrent Enrollment office for review. If the Sophomore is accepted, the CE Coordinator will be notified and the student will be registered for the requested courses.

This acceptance is not automatic and is reviewed on a student –by- student basis.

It is very important to remember that Concurrent Enrollment courses will generate a college transcript. Poor grades may affect future financial aid, scholarship opportunities and college acceptance. Sophomore seeking higher level credit are held to the same standards as Juniors and Seniors as well as UVSC students attending on campus.
