

# UVU and the New Century Scholarship

## New Century Scholarship Information

The New Century Scholarship is funded by the Utah State legislature. The scholarship is awarded to eligible students who complete an associate degree in arts or sciences the same year the student graduates from high school. The scholarship will pay seventy-five percent of tuition at any four-year institution in Utah for the next sixty hours or a bachelor's degree (whichever option is fully utilized first). ## Scholarship Requirements

The forms needed to apply for the New Century Scholarship can be accessed from the following website (bottom of first page):

Items to be submitted:

1. The completed New Century application form
2. High school transcript showing your grade-point average, graduation date, and your ACT scores.
3. College transcript showing degree awarded
4. College grade-point average must be 3.0 or higher (3.0=B average).
5. College work must be completed by September 1 of the year student graduates from high school.

## UVSC Application Process

To begin the application process, go to the internet and type in the address:

This internet address will take you to the concurrent enrollment website. From this website the application process, registration of classes, etc., can be accessed.

If you encounter problems, each high school in the Alpine, Provo, and Nebo school districts have UVU concurrent enrollment facilitators who should be able to help you. You can also call the UVU Concurrent Enrollment Office, (801) 863-8376.

## College Curriculum

Students graduating from UVU are required to take a minimum of twenty credits from UVSC.

Other credits can be earned by using some or a combination of the following methods:

4. Taking courses from other colleges and transferring them to UVSC
5. UVU on-campus classes (which will require regular tuition and fees payment).

## Academic Progress
